4. PC Newsletters

7. Updates From Network Groups

St Martin's – The chairman of the Carbon reduction team is aiming for the gold Eco Award, despite the current chairman having just stepped down. Catherine has a Blue Heart sign to donate to the church. A pre-application to consider solar panels for the roof has been submitted to GBC.

St Mary's – The Nature Photo Competition has been held successfully. Awards for young church members include Josh, under 15s and Lorna over 15s. A slideshow will be presented next time which will also include asking the congregation to monitor wildlife via a recommended app: iNaturalist for iPhone and Android. The God's Acre website has a link and information on recording nature. St Mary's is looking to set up a Nature trail.

CB is holding a flower workshop on 07/08/24 at the farm on the Wednesday morning for Church Flowers.

Active travel- CY is working with GBC and SCC at two new trails/footpaths to connect green routes across the local area:

- a) The Horsley Accessible Ring Trail (HART) which will connect current permissible routes to a 'permissive path' would carry on from the Bridleway at West Horsley Place, through the back of St Martin's Court to public footpaths in East Horsley.
- b) A path leading out from the Queen's Head pub in East Clandon that would use existing public footpaths and extend these so that you can walk or cycle to Clandon Station in West Clandon.

Repair Café- CJ reported that the second Repair Café had taken place with 19 attendees and was very successful with attendees very impressed. It will take place on the first Saturday morning of each month at St. Martin's Canterbury Rooms.

8. AOB

The local Pharmacy has ceased collecting pill packs owing to the cost of the box. This is a facility we would not like to lose, and Mel suggested that East and West Horsley PCs consider sponsoring a bag rather than a box. MB to follow up. Make-up container recycling has been very successful at the East Horsley Library.
