LOOKING BACK, LOOKING FORWARD...

As our new term of office begins, a reflection on achievements over the last 4 years. We set out our strategic vision and here's some of the highlights and accomplishments:

- Came through a pandemic

TASK GROUPS COVERING YOUR VILLAGE



FINANCE

The Parish Council has been using computer software for its Financial Statements for 2 years now and it means the Clerk/ Responsible Financial Officer and the Councillors have a more immediate view of the expenditure of the precept against budget.

The budget setting starts in the September of the current financial year, with the Committees/Task Group leaders asked to provide their estimates of what they expect to spend for the following year. This is collated and the total compared to the current year's precept.

It is then usually a matter of saying what the groups would like to spend on the village and what is possible! This is not always helped by the fact that the salaries, which are based on a national scale, are often not agreed for the current year let alone the next one.


HORSLEY HUSTLE FUN RUN

THE ORCHARD

West Horsley has its own Orchard for the enjoyment of residents. It is in the triangle of land at the junction of The Street and Ripley Lane. The Orchard has recently been restored with some new heritage fruit trees and soft fruits planted to replace those that were old and dying. When the fruit has ripened anyone in the village can have a pick, provided some is left for the next person. Our environment is important for us all and the WHPC works hard to try, as far as possible, to keep West Horsley as a good place in which to live.

Sadly, when hedges are ripped out and replaced with close boarded fencing, we lose our 'green corridors' for the movement of wildlife, so please think twice before ripping that hedge out. Hedges may be more difficult to maintain but they give the village that green look and capture carbon in this time of climate change.

NIGHTINGALE CRESCENT PLATINUM JUBILEE TREES

In line with a previous campaign for the Queen's Green Canopy, the Parish Council launched the idea to plant 7 trees in the Crescent to celebrate the 7 decades of the Queen's Reign. Thanks to the support of GBC in planting and Cllr Catherine Young the permissions were granted for planting. The cost of trees were funded by The Akerman beguest and the last of the trees were planted early February.

A commemorative plaque has now been installed in appreciation of the Queen and the Ackerman beguest.

HORSLEY MEADOWS CONSERVATION **PROJECTS**

Over this last winter, a group of local volunteers, alongside Surrey Wildlife Trust, have spent time planting hedgerow saplings, to repair and improve the invaluable wildlife corridors that exist across the site. (SANG off Long Reach) The hedgerows consist of a mix of native species, including hawthorn, beech, crab apple, and guelder rose, providing food and shelter all year round for a myriad of mammals, birds, and insects, and forming essential corridors to link areas of woodland.

We have been advised that, within two years. our tiny, little saplings will have grown into a very healthy hedgerow. Do wander up there if you haven't already visited Horsley Meadows. There is a 2.3km trail that winds its way around the site. In the Summer we have Skylarks nesting, and the meadows are full of wild grasses and flowers.

VOLUNTEERS IN HEALTH, WEALTH, AND SAFETY IN THE VILLAGE



Neighbourhood Connections is a community project run by volunteers, that provides information about support available in and around your area. A service for anyone in the community as we all need help at different times in our lives. Based in the Horsley Medical Practice, once a week, from 2-4pm on either Wednesday or Friday. Call to book in with Neighbourhood Connections' trained volunteers, who can provide a listening ear, information and advice about local support and activities, such as local transport, groups, household help, statutory services and more.

Please note that although based at the medical practice, Neighbourhood Connections is not a medical service; it's a way to address social and practical needs and to help make connections between you and support services that may be relevant to you.

HORSLEYS COMMUNITY FUND

The Horsleys Community Fund (HCF) was established in 2010 to enable residents of East and West Horsley to support their neighbours. In 2015 another local charitable trust, the Lady Noel Byron Nursing Trust, was incorporated into HCF. The fund is managed by a group of trustees drawn from both villages, who work to encourage donations to the fund and to enable grants from it.

The returns from our investments are passed to a fund used for making grants. At the end of March 2023, HCF had just over £300,000 in the endowment funds which is a remarkable achievement and a wonderful source of income generation for current and future village needs – it really is the gift that keeps on giving!

Over £129,000 has been given in donations with additional Gift Aid and matched funding of £55,000. This has allowed us to distribute 73 grants to 40 recipients over the years totalling £65,000 and ranging in size from £80 to £2500. Relatively modest amounts of money can make a huge difference to small organisations who may not have access to other funds and the feedback has been fantastic. All this is run by volunteers, to whom we are hugely grateful. So, thank you all!

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH

CSW is run by volunteers trained and supported by Surrey Police. It has been operating in the Village for over 5 years and currently has a team of 12 with Graham Edwards and Edward Scott being coordinators. The aim is to help our Village roads be safe by keeping speed to the legal limit. Currently, there are 9 approved sites across the Village the most recent of which is on the A246, Epsom Road. Volunteers give an hour or two of their time each month to run a session; we work in pairs.

Occasionally, we are joined by a Traffic Police Officer as the photo shows, PC Peter Hawkins with Elaine. The Police have powers to charge on the spot so watch out! CSW record details of the speed and vehicle which are then entered into the national police data base so repeat offenders may receive notification or a visit by the Police. Interestingly, the most regular and serious offenders for speeding are those who live in the Village! We are looking for more volunteers. We would love to hear from you. ROAD UPDATE UNDER THE BRIDGE

A high-power jetting machine was used to jet the area under the bridge and on investigation there was already a connection connecting the discharging gully to the culvert on the other side of the road. This connection was blocked but after some jetting the blockage was cleared allowing water to flow from the pond to the gully and across the road to the culvert which should solve half of the problem.

However, further down the road a collapsed section of pipe was discovered, and the idea is to install a new section of pipe to bypass the damaged section and divert water across the road into the culvert on the other side. This should alleviate future flooding. We now wait for a further update as to when these works will take place. Please keep an eye on our e-bulletin boards for updates.




SITE A35 – FORMER WISLEY AIRFIELD, OCKHAM REF: 22/P/01175

The developers, Taylor Wimpey (TW), have gone to determination for their application and provided approximately 100 more documents. However, many of the previous problems that prompted over 1000 objections from residents and local organisations, including all local councils, have not been addressed and we expect that there will be a further delay in GBC.

Furthermore, Hallam Land, who own a site which adjoins the Wisley Airfield site, have submitted an application to develop 70 new homes on their site, which would form part of the larger scheme if approved.

West Horsley have joined forces with our friends at East Horsley PC to make and submit a joint objection to both the Hallam Land scheme and also further objections to the TW application, having taken advice from several specialist consultants. No doubt TW will keep pushing but this is such a contentious scheme that it requires careful consideration. Watch this space!



COMMUNITY FORUM

It is not unusual for people to say "why doesn't somebody do something about it?" The Parish Council spends much time trying "to do something". One way of trying to tell you what we are doing is via the Community Forum meetings.

We have already held one meeting at the Village Hall on Education, i.e., concerning the likely impact on pupil numbers after the new houses

have been built in the Horsleys. We heard from representatives of Surrey CC as well as the head teachers at our local schools. In summary Surrey thinks there's no problem however, some of the teachers think there is still an issue. Hence, WHPC is now investigating, in cooperation with EHPC, whether Surrey's optimism is justified or whether they should reconsider their position. We will keep you posted of our progress.

The next Forum is in relation to

the health services provided across the Horsleys, and the impact upon them from the new housing estates, as well as the potential new village at Wisley. We intend to invite representatives from the Medical Centre and the local Health Authority to inform us what the difficulties are and what solutions are proposed. We will obviously publicise the date so we can ensure the attendance of all those who want to know "what somebody is doing about it".
